Year 7 HT2	In this first unit, students are introduced to the concept of Citizenship and will consider the rights and responsibilities citizens have. They will explore the rights we have in the UK and where these rights come from and consider whether everyone has these rights,
Year 7 HT3	both here in the UK and elsewhere.
	Discrimination
Year 7 HT4	Students will then go on to explore the issue of discrimination and consider a variety of reasons why people may be discriminated against including: race, gender and disability. In this unit, students will have an opportunity to take citizenship action through completion of a disability access survey of the school site and following this up with
Year 7 HT5	appropriate actions to make positive improvements within the school.
	Global issues - Environmental responsibility
Year 7 HT6	In this final unit, students will be looking at a range of issues citizens have contributed to within our environment including: pollution and climate change and consider how these can be sustainably managed. They will consider the role we, as citizens, have in trying to solve the world's environmental problems.
Year 8 HT1	Students will complete a 10 week course and will study:
	Identity and Diversity in the UK
Year 8 HT2	In this unit, students explore what a community is and consider how and why our communities and becoming more diverse. They will consider the impact of migration on communities and the UK as whole before considering the importance of community cohesion in the UK.
Year 8 HT3	
	The Media Within this unit, students will explore different type of media and the changing role it
Year 8 HT4	has in the UK. They will consider factors affecting media bias and the importance of a free press in a democratic society.
	Crime and Justice
Year 8 HT5	In this final unit, students will study changing trends in crime in the UK and the different punishments available in the UK justice system, considering their effectiveness in preventing crime and reoffending They will then look at the way the
Year 8 HT6	youth justice system in the UK works and consider its effectiveness in preventing incidences of crime in young people.

Year 9 HT1	Students will complete a 10 week course and will study: People of Power and Influence In this unit, students will look at several case studies of people who have demonstrated power and influence through a range of different strategies in order to make positive changes within society across a range of societal issues. Taking Citizenship Action Students will then complete an action project where they will select an issue from the citizenship course, research, plan and implement an action in order to make a positive difference to the issue. Students will learn their role within a democratic society and explore how they can make a positive contribution.
