	Content
Year 11 HT1	<p><u>Theme D Power and Influence</u></p> <p>In this first unit of Year 11, students will explore a range of ways in which people can make contributions within society from political roles to volunteering to pressure groups. They will explore different methods used by these different groups within society to make changes and exert influence over others.</p>
Year 11 HT2	<p><u>Theme E Taking Citizenship Action</u></p> <p>In this unit, students will complete an action project where they will select an issue from the citizenship course, research, plan and implement an action in order to make a positive difference to the issue. Students will learn their role within a democratic society and explore how they can make a positive contribution through taking appropriate action, evaluating their actions and impacts as they do so. Students will also explore case studies of other people's actions and consider their approaches and impacts in the context of their issue.</p>

Year 11 HT4	<p><u>Theme D Power and Influence</u></p> <p>In this half term, students will return to the power and influence theme and will explore the role of the media in the UK. Students will then explore the UK's role in the wider world through studying different organisations that the UK is a member of such as: the Commonwealth, the UN, NATO and WTO. Students will look at the UK's role in conflict and will look at the idea of international justice too.</p>
Year 11 HT5	<p><u>Deeper Learning - Targeted Revision</u></p> <p>Within this half term, students will be revisiting key content from the GCSE specification and looking in greater depth at case studies, taking a more synoptic approach in their evaluation of key ideas and themes across the citizenship specification, making links between different areas of the course.</p>
