

Lesson 3:

Based on what you have learnt from the Prologue, write your own prologue to a story which you know well.

For example, you may choose to write a prologue to 'Beauty and the Beast', 'The Three Little Pigs', 'Star Wars' or any other age appropriate story of your choice.

Challenge:

Make your prologue similar to that of Romeo and Juliet – in the style of a sonnet. (14 lines long, with alternate rhyming lines for 12 lines, finishing with a rhyming couplet.)

Additional challenge: Write your prologue in blank verse. This means all of the lines should have exactly 10 syllables.
