

Priorities:

1. Continue to improve outcomes for all Pupil Premium grant (PPG) students to bring attainment in line with the expected levels of progress
2. Continue to narrow the achievement gap of all PPG students
3. Narrow the attendance gap between PPG eligible students and cohort
4. Improve engagement and behaviour for learning for PPG eligible students

December 2015 Review

Actions:	Impact to Date:
Improve attendance	PPG attendance is up to 95.6% (above National Average)
Improve PPG attainment	PPG 5ACEM predicted to be 48% (8% higher than non-PPG)
Improve PPG progress	PPG Progress 8 is predicted to be +0.0 (up from -0.3, last year)
More Specific Actions:	Impact to Date:
Improve PPG and SEN students' progress	PPG Progress 8 is now +0.0
Increase number of LSAs to support students	In October we employed 3 additional LSAs
Reduce number of "on-calls" by PPG students	On-calls significantly reduced in Autumn term
Improve PPG students' Maths AC to above 50%	Current predictions show 50% PPG students expected to get Maths at C+
Improve PPG students' English AC – early entry GCSE entered by 16 students	56% of students expected to get grade C+ when November exam results come in to school in January.
Improve the admin relating to PPG	School records have already been cross-referenced and updated after consultation with DFE
Provide a free breakfast club for all PPG students	Breakfast club is now a consistently popular feature of school life from 7.30am until 8.20am.

Next Steps:

- Continue to monitor attendance; if necessary work closely with individual students to maintain this year's improvement
- Continue to support PPG students in Maths and English. Ensure that interventions are timely and specific. Arrange additional testing opportunities, which will then, in turn, inform the next action
- Continue to provide opportunities for students to improve their progress for all abilities and ages

March 2016 Review

Actions:	Impact to Date:
Improve attendance	PPG attendance is at 94.2% (above National Average)
Improve PPG attainment	PPG 5ACEM predicted to be 46% (6% higher than non-PPG)
Improve PPG progress	PPG Progress 8 is predicted to be +0.1 (up from -0.3, last year)
More Specific Actions:	Impact to Date:
Improve PPG and SEN students' progress	PPG Progress 8 is now +0.1
Increase number of LSAs to support students	In October we employed 3 additional LSAs
Reduce number of "on-calls" by PPG students	On-calls have continued to reduce in the Spring term
Improve PPG students' Maths AC to above 50%	Current predictions show 54% PPG students expected to get Maths at C+
Improve PPG students' English AC – early entry GCSE entered by 16 students	75% of students achieved grade C+ when November exam results in January. 83% of all PPG students expected to have achieved at least grade C in English.

Next Steps:

- Continue to monitor attendance to maintain figure above National Average and provide additional support for individual students identified with additional needs.
- Use most recent data to further support PPG students in Maths and English. Use diagnostic testing and analysis to inform individualised programmes of support.
- Through regular data collection monitor students' progress in all year groups across the curriculum and put in place planned interventions.
